ARRANGEMENTS FOR SEPTEMBER

The latest guidance for schools has been released in advance of September, however, there are many questions which remain unanswered and, as you know as well as we do, things can change very quickly! We will be awaiting clarity of the finer details from the Department for Education and Public Health over the summer holidays and will then write to parents before school starts in September with any further updates.

CHANGES TO CONTACT TRACING IN EDUCATION AND CHILDCARE SETTINGS

As you know, the Prime Minister announced on 12 July that Step 4 of the roadmap would go ahead on Monday 19th July. One of the key changes that will take place from 19th July is that education and childcare settings will no longer be asked to conduct routine contact tracing. In a nutshell, if we are informed of a positive case in school on or after Monday, we will not be required to close a bubble! As with positive cases in any other setting, NHS Test and Trace will work with either the positive case to identify close contacts.

Please see the letter sent via ParentMail earlier today which sets out in more detail how that process will work and what you need to do if your child tests positive for COVID-19.


