



The United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (UK) is made up of four countries. England and Wales united in 1284. Then, Scotland became part of the union in 1707 and Northern Ireland in 1921. Together, England, Wales and Scotland are known as Great Britain. Northern Ireland is part of the island of Ireland. The flag of the United Kingdom is called the Union Flag and is red, white and blue. When flown at sea, the flag is known as the Union Jack.

The UK belongs to the continent of Europe.

There are several seas that surround the UK, these are:

- Irish Sea
- Atlantic Ocean
- North Sea
- English Channel

The United Kingdom is part of the British Isles.

The British Isles is a group of islands (archipelago) that consists of Great Britain and more than 6000 smaller islands.

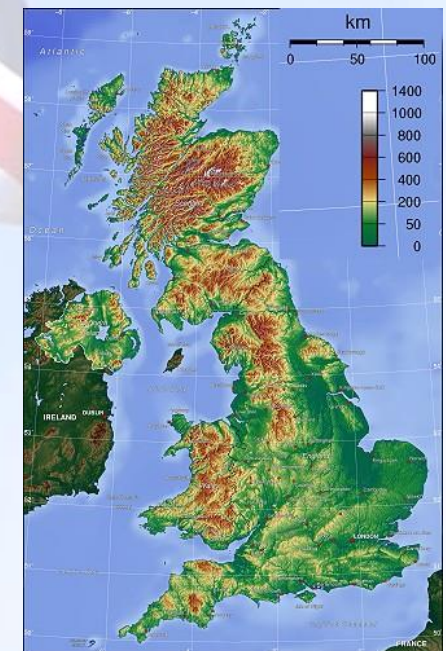

England is the largest country in the United Kingdom.

England's population is estimated to be around 55.5 million.

The flag of England is called the St George's cross, which is named after its patron saint, St George.

Scotland is one of the four countries of the United Kingdom and has an estimated population of 5.5 million.

The capital city of Scotland is Edinburgh. Scotland contains many cities as well as vast rural areas too.

The national flag is the Saltire or St Andrew's Cross, named after its patron saint, St Andrew.

Wales is one of the four countries of the United Kingdom with an estimated population of 3 million.

Wales has six cities and many rural areas. The capital city of Wales is Cardiff.

The national flag is the Red Dragon and the Patron Saint is St David.

Northern Ireland is one of the four countries of the United Kingdom and has an estimated population of just under 2 million.

Northern Ireland has five cities and many rural areas. The capital city of Northern Ireland is Belfast.

The national flag is the Union Flag of the UK but the Ulster Banner is used at sporting events. It shares its emblem, the clover leaf, and its patron saint, St Patrick, with Ireland.
