## English



## **Mathematics**

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During the Summer Term, Year 5 units of work are:

- Converting units of measure
- Calculating with whole numbers and decimals
- 2-D and 3-D shape
- Volume
- Problem solving

## Reading

This half-term, we will be reading extracts taken from a range of texts, including recommended novels, nonfiction and poetry.

We will then undertake our novel study of 'The Secret Garden' by Frances Hodgson Burnett.

Throughout these lessons, we will be developing our skills in fluency, activating background knowledge, unfamiliar vocabulary, exploring visualising and comprehension.

## Geography

In Geography, we are extending our learning of the Amazon Rainforest to the continent of South America, focusing predominantly on Rio and South East Brazil.

In this unit, pupils will become confident with the human and physical features and will be able to compare this to the UK. When studying the countries and capital cities in South America, pupils will explore the concept of time zones and why we have different time zones around the world. In addition, pupils will be investigating the impact of urbanisation in Brazil and will be discovering why Rio de Janeiro is known as a city of two halves.

# Science



In Science, we are moving onto the study of **Biology**, where we will be learning to describe the life cycle of a mammal, amphibian, insect and bird and explore the life cycle of a plant.

We will also explore key humanitarians who have contributed to the study of living things.

## History

In History, we are completing our topic on the Anglo-Saxons; looking at significant battles, conversion to Christianity and Anglo-Saxon achievements.

We then look at the next invasion of Britain by the Ferocious Vikings!

Here we will focus on our six 'key concepts' for example: chronology, sources and evidence, historical significance and the similarity and differences between England at the time of the Anglo-Saxons and England under Viking rule.

## **RSHE**

- We will learn about democracy and having a voice benefits the school community.
- We will learn how to contribute towards the democratic process
- We will understand the rights and responsibilities associated with being a citizen in the wider community and their country.

- We will learn know how an individual's behaviour can affect a group and the consequences of this.

### **Religious Education**

Our next R.E. units for the summer term will be Christianity and Islam focusing on Beliefs and Practices.

Our enquiry question for this unit is, "What is the best way for a Christian/a Muslim to show commitment to God?"

We will be answering this enquiry question by considering how Christians show their commitment to God and to evaluate if there is a 'best way'.

## Art & Design

In Art, we will be focusing on sculpture and 3D art.

In this unit, we will learn about installation art, including identifying and comparing art installations, exploring space and scale in 3D art, problem-solving in construction, planning installations to communicate ideas, and applying knowledge to develop and present installation art pieces effectively.

## Computing

This half-term, we will be 'Creating Media' exploring stop-motion animations. They will understand that stop motion animation is an animation filmed one frame at a time using models, and with tiny changes between each photograph. They will also have an understanding that editing is an important feature of making and improving a stop motion animation.
